





OVERVIEW

ICC Sydney welcomed over 1200 in-person and virtual attendees for the Carbon Market Institute's (CMI) largest Australasian Emissions Reduction Summit, a national business and climate action conference and exhibition.

Held for the first time in Sydney at ICC Sydney, this hybrid event facilitated knowledge sharing, commercial interaction and capacity building across carbon markets, industry action, technology, finance, policy and international climate development areas. Originally scheduled prior to the global United Nations Climate Change Conference, COP26, but rescheduled due to COVID-19 restrictions, through collaborative scenario planning the team adapted the format.

CMI adjusted the program to focus on the impact of COVID on human behaviour and innovation, bringing closer the urgent need for business, government, and communities to work together to address the climate crisis.

The curated program featured high level panels and keynotes in ICC Sydney's Pyrmont Theatre from both national and international climate change leaders, exhibitions featuring leading carbon service providers and a carbon neutral menu featuring a ICC Sydney New South Wales wine supplier, Ross Hill from Orange.
